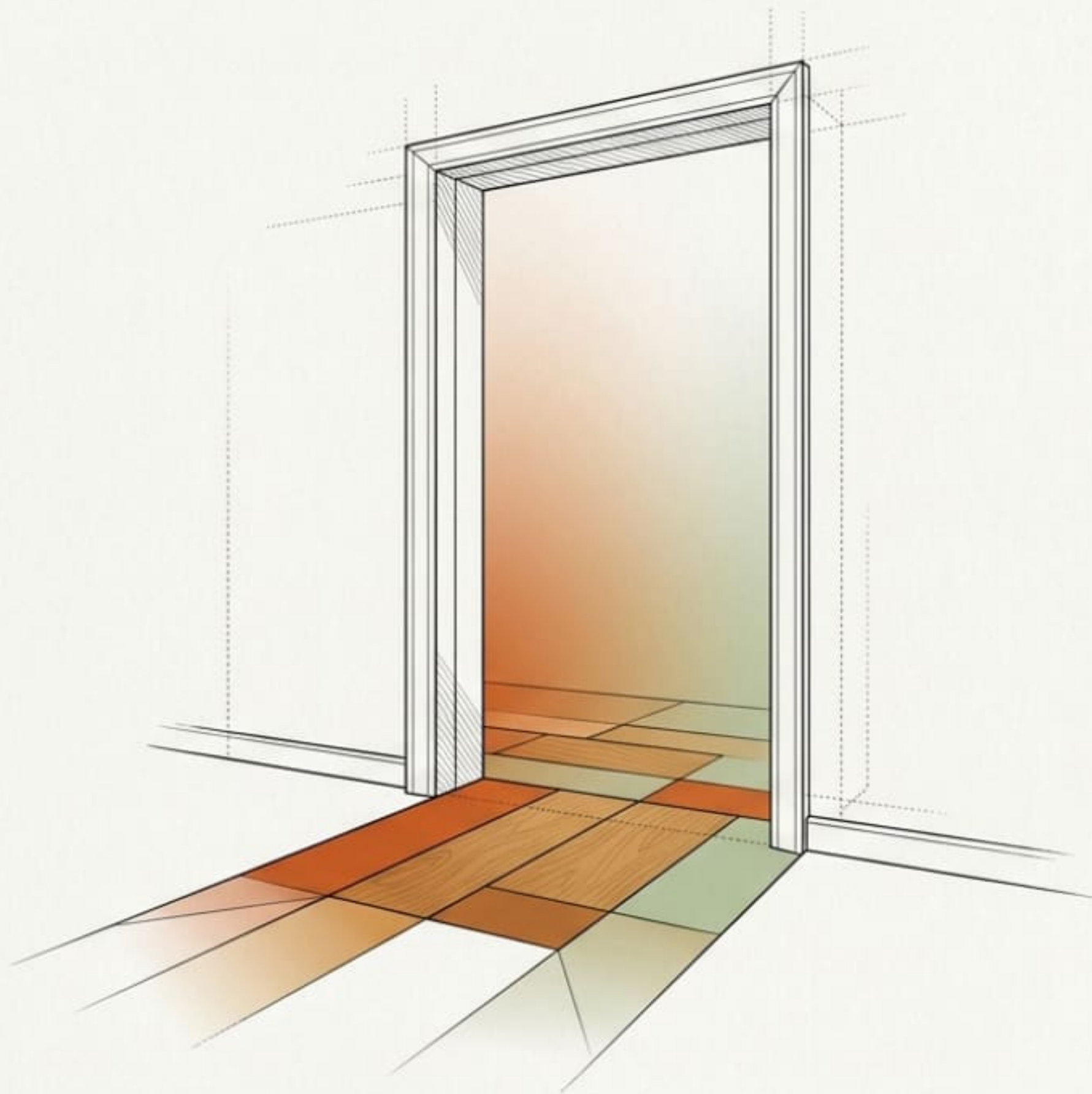
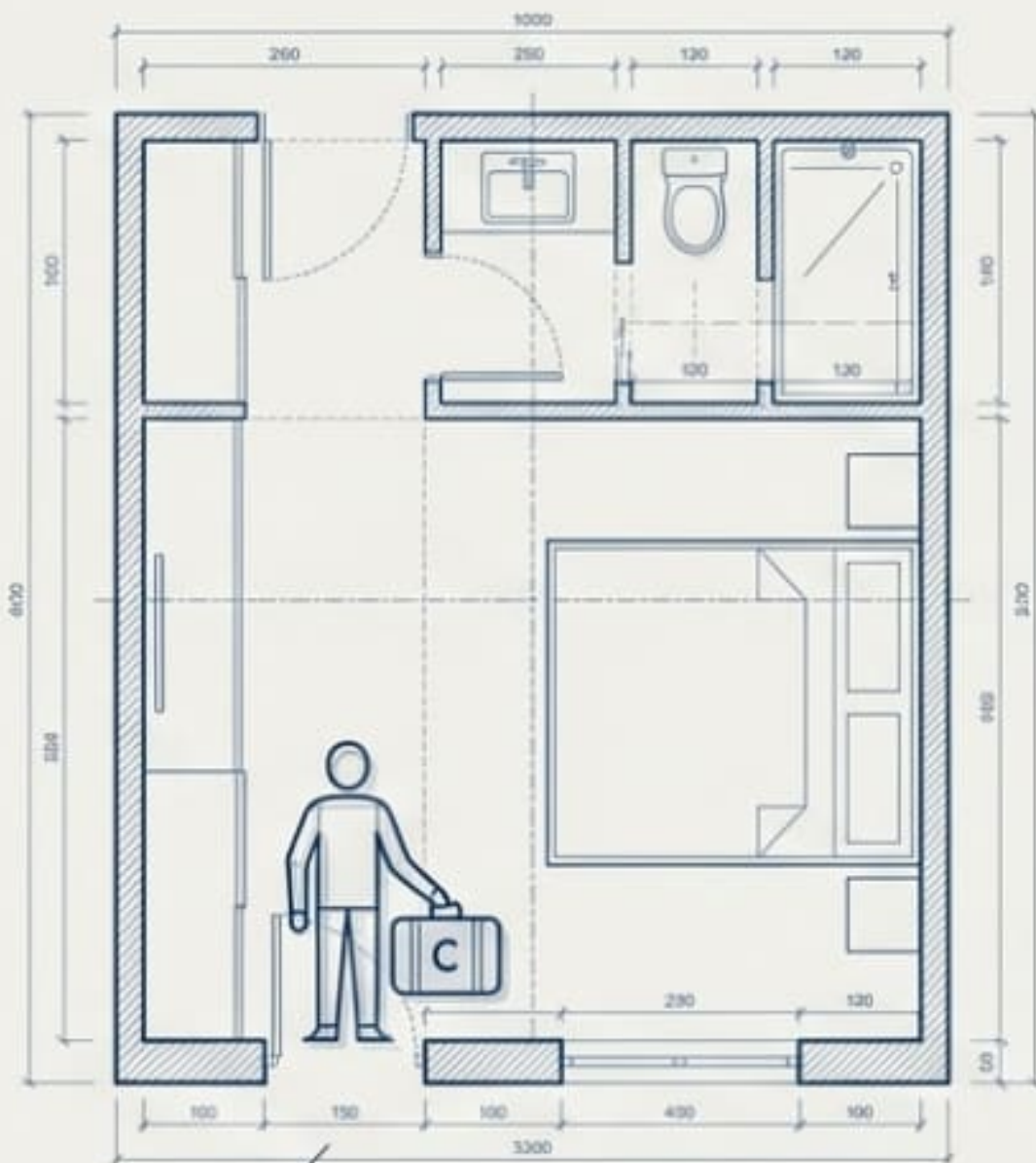


Of Me: Beta Walk-Through

and what it can't do yet. (August 2026)



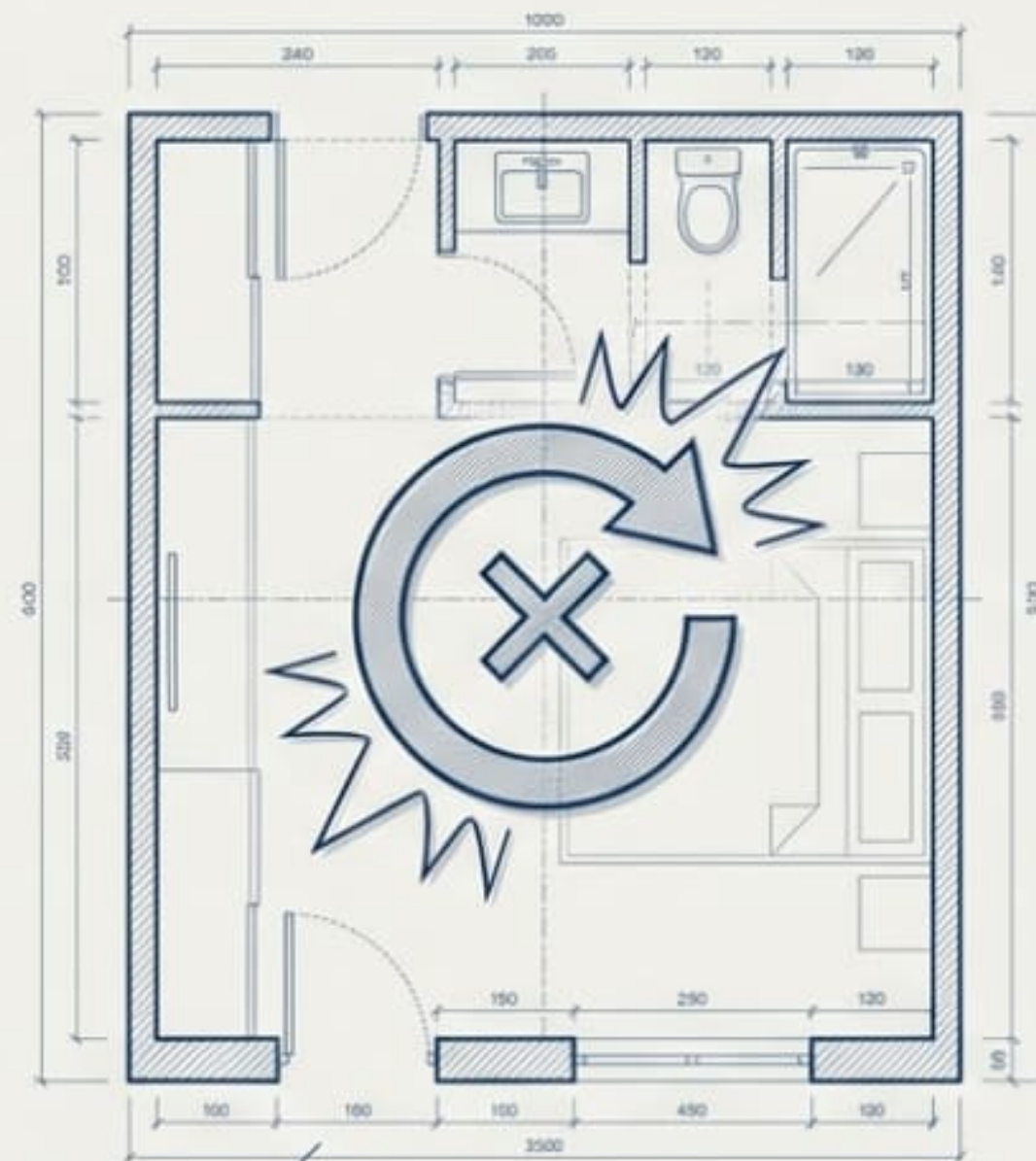
Today, every conversation starts from zero



Close the window and it's gone.



Open a new one and you start again.



Switch to a different AI, and none of it will carry over. The help stays generic.

Stop renting. Hold the deed.



The house forms around the patterns of your life



Nobody hands you a floor plan
of every possible life.

Rooms get built when there's something to put in them.

The only chore: 15 minutes of setup

The part that pays off: Story Time

INTAKE VENT

Tell one

In your own words.
No long forms. The

what you've kept).

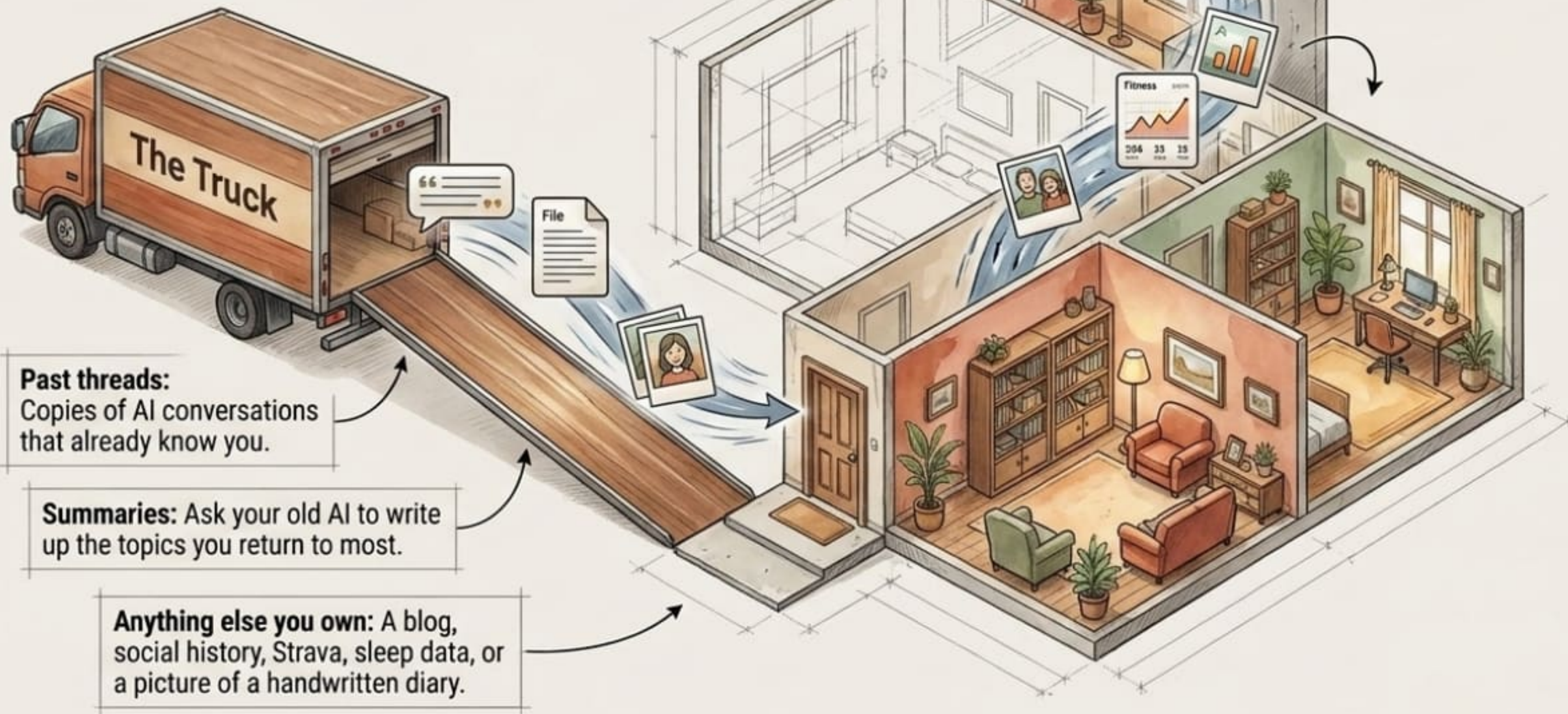
Remember it

Shelve one

"Not now."
Kept safe, not lost,
not nagged about.

Accelerating its understanding of you



Phase 1: The house is working

It catches things you got wrong

You said she was twelve that summer. What you wrote that August says she turned eleven.



It keeps count when you don't

That's the fourth time in three years you've said you're done taking on too much.



It gets you ready before you walk in

Lunch with him in an hour...
Everything you've ever said about him, including the thing you promised him and forgot.



It answers things nothing else can

What was I doing the last time I felt like this? It gives you the date, what you wrote, and what happened next.



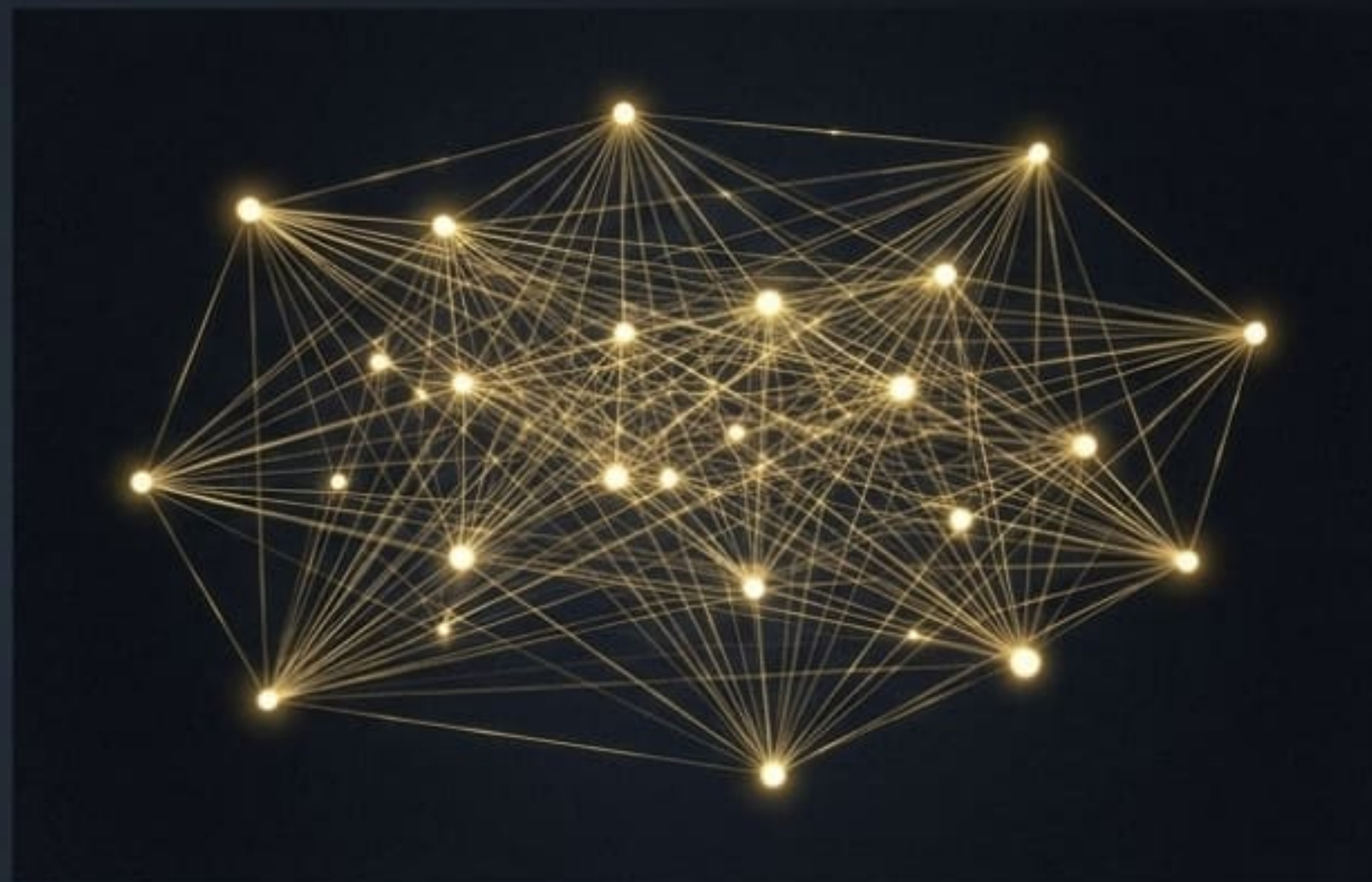
The Recognition

The Human Experience



You lived it one day at a time. You remember it in pieces—the loud parts, the recent parts. The rest you can't get to.

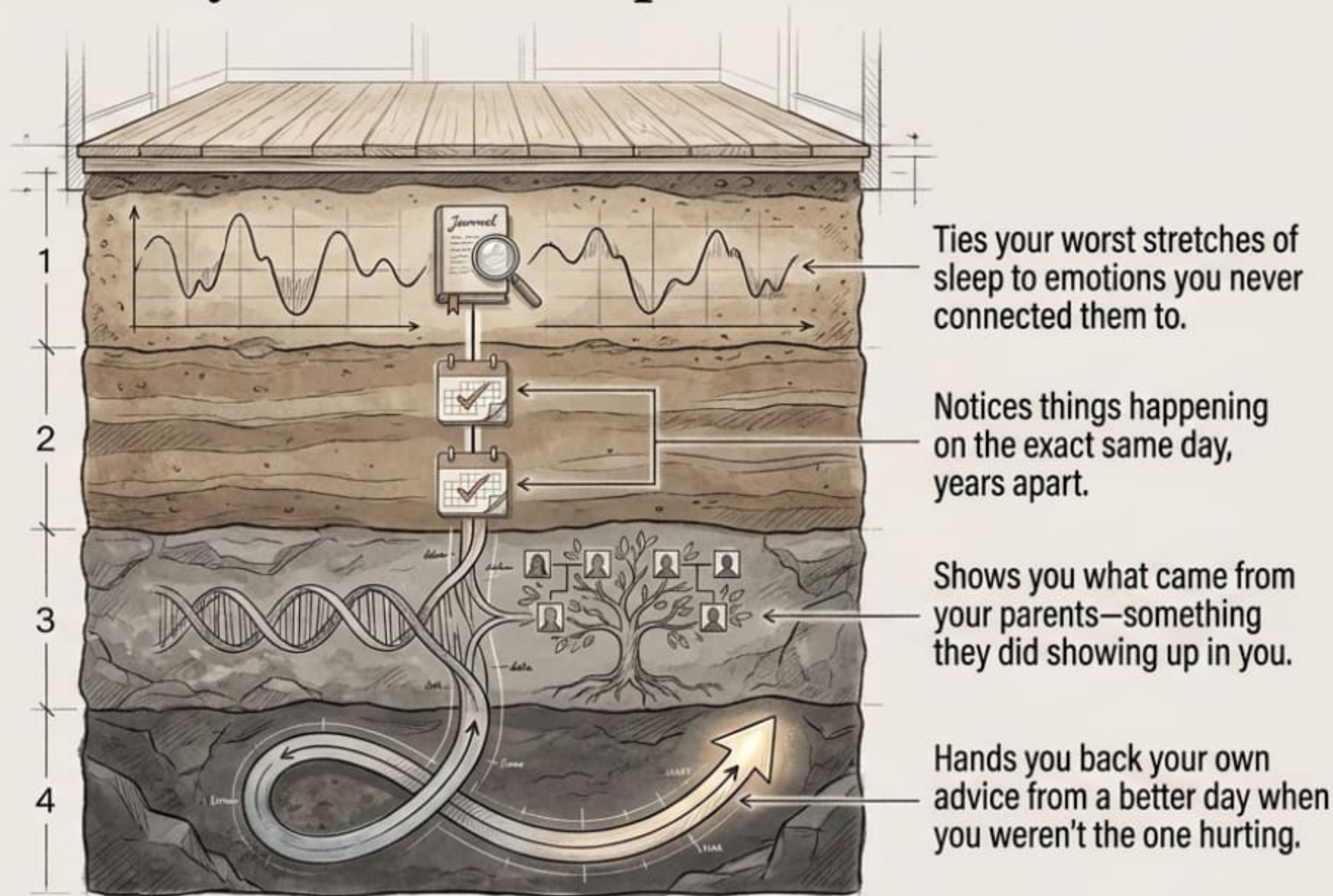
The AI Synthesis



The AI puts something you said this year next to something you said twenty years ago. It sees all of you at once.

The moment it shows you something true about yourself that you'd never put together before.
It doesn't judge you. It pays attention.

When your context spans a life

(This is the beta)

IDEA

Handing someone a life,
in your own words

Notice, don't interrupt



No drip campaigns, no streaks, no manufactured occasions to stay in your day.

Father's day is in two weeks. Buy a card now so you have time to personalize it by hand?



Rare. Plain offers. Noticing is always allowed; interrupting you is not.

The constraints that make this yours



Never sold, and never rented out.



Won't pretend to be you, or speak as you.



No ads. No one buys their way to you.



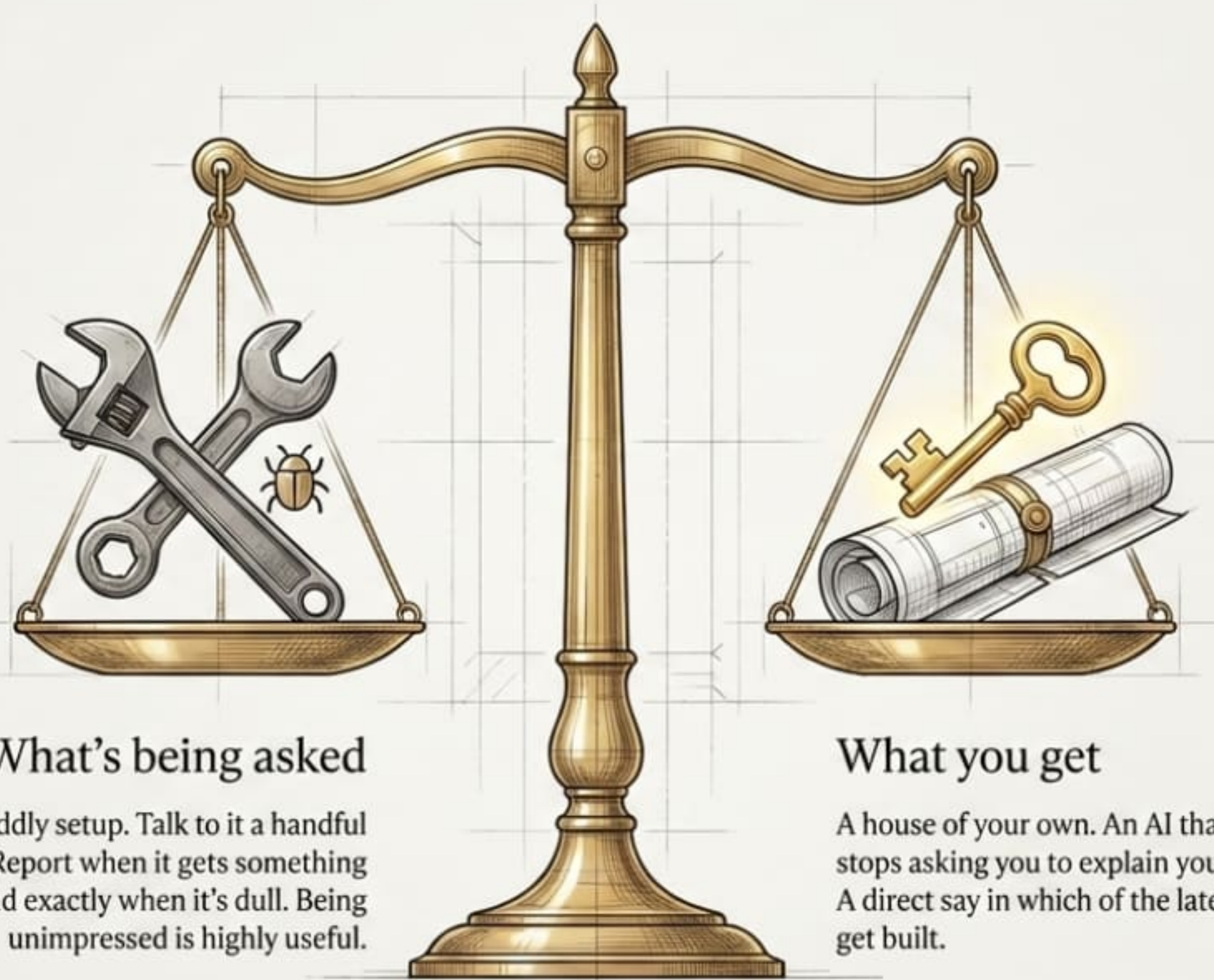
Instructed to help foster human-human connection, not stand in for them.



NO EMPLOYER ACCESS — ever, for anyone.

It holds what happened and observes; it doesn't hand down verdicts about who you are.

The Beta Trade-Off



What's being asked

Endure the fiddly setup. Talk to it a handful of times. Report when it gets something wrong, and exactly when it's dull. Being unimpressed is highly useful.

What you get

A house of your own. An AI that finally stops asking you to explain yourself. A direct say in which of the later phases get built.

August Onward



Sep 15: The paying question
(Of Me is free, but their AI plan
is \$20/month. Is it worth it?)



Aug 1 — 7:
Concept and beta
scoping.

Aug 8 — 14:
Scope closed, fix
the fiddly parts first.

Aug 15 — Sep 15:
6 testers, one month of daily use.

In Parallel: Branding, target markets (kids of aging parents,
people in recovery, writers).

Dates are intent, not commitments. The beta runs a month because that is how long a paid AI plan has to be worth it before anyone can say whether it was.
